# Shingles a Threat to Seniors

### **Vaccination recommended for those over 60**

had a note from Helen Luna, a graduate of the class of 1963. She enlightened me to the fact that her sister, Janet, from the class of 1959, is suffering from Post Herpetic Neuralgia (PHN).

PHN is the pain that remains after Shingles (herpes zoster) lesions have healed. Shingles is a blistering rash that occurs only if you previously have had chickenpox. The chickenpox virus lies dormant in the nerves and shingles occurs when it is revitalized. Infections, stress, being generally run down, and a lowered immune system can cause the virus to become active at any time. Along with the rash, fatigue, aches/pains, and even a mild fever may occur. The shingle blisters burst and crust over usually within a week and the area slowly heals. Pain may subside as quickly as the rash, but some people are left with pain affecting that area for *many months or even years*. The pain could become crippling.

"I see what happens to Janet," Helen said, "because of the medications she's on for the extremely painful PHN. Both Helen and Janet want our readers to be aware of the consequences of Shingles.

Helen said, "I'm not exactly sure of the percentage off-hand, but it's something like 30 to 40 per cent of people over 60 who get shingles have a chance for it to develop into PHN and sometimes it never goes away. Janet explained to me that the percentage of people who could develop PHN after shingles, goes even higher after age 65...to something like 60%. And the pain is excruciating! I think she's into her third year with the PHN and unfortunately, it changes your whole life. It took me about five minutes, after seeing the pain she was in, to go and get the shingles shot."

The recommended vaccine, Zostavax, is safe according to the FDA. Zostavax does not treat shingles or PHN once it develops.

All Medicare Part D plans cover the shingles vaccine. The amount of cost-sharing (money *you* have to pay) for vaccination varies. Medicare Part B does *not* cover the shingles vaccine. If you have private insurance or Medicaid, your plan may or may not cover the vaccine; contact your insurer to find out.


# FOCUS ON...
