Scrumptious Spinach Salad

What would a good recipe be without a story? My husband, Charlie [Syosset '62], makes a great Spinach Salad, but he doesn't make it often. I convinced him to make it for dinner with friends, Gail (Cluxton) and Tom Sneyd '63. It was November, and Gail and I were celebrating our birthdays.

At the time, we had a screened in porch. It was totally unusable in the winter, so we would pile all the summer furniture—chairs, tables, planters, etc.—around the perimeter of the porch until Spring.

So, Charlie made his salad. I couldn't wait—crumbles of bacon and shredded hard boiled egg covered the top of the greens like icing on a cake. But there was no room in the fridge to store the salad until dinner time.

"Let's put it on the porch. It's cold enough there," I said. "Just be sure to put it up high enough so Churchy doesn't try to eat it," I added, jokingly. "Churchy" was our little Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, Churchill. She was 14 lbs of fun, with a nose for food.

Gail and Tom arrived. We had some wine, chatted a while, and sat down for dinner. I opened the door to the porch and reached up for the salad, and let out a cry of dismay. All that was left in the bowl was a pile of spinach and some sliced mushrooms. All the egg and bacon were gone. Churchill had jumped up on a box, then to an end table, onto a stacked chair and continued her circuitous route around the perimeter of the room, climbing higher and higher until she reached the salad. There, she happily munched on the salad goodies, made her way back around to the floor, into her little bed, to look up innocently at me when she heard my cry of dismay. "Who, me?"

Needless to say, there was no salad that night. But try this recipe. It's scrumptious. Just don't let the dogs get it.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 bag spinach leaves
- 4-6 strips of bacon
- 2 eggs
- ¼ to ½ pound white mushrooms
- ¼ cup Red wine vinegar
- ¼ Olive oil (approximate)
- ½ tsp sugar
- Salt

DIRECTIONS:

Hard-boil eggs and cool. Cook bacon extra-crisp, reserve about $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of the bacon fat, and allow the bacon to cool on paper towels. Slice mushrooms thin; rinse and dry spinach.

Put the spinach in a large salad bowl. Place sliced mushrooms on top, crumble the bacon and sprinkle it over the top, and grate the hard-boiled eggs over the bacon.

Make the dressing by combining the warm $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of bacon fat, olive oil and vinegar to taste, a pinch of sugar and some salt. Beat with a whisk until smooth, adjust to taste, pour over the salad, and toss.



Serves 2 people.

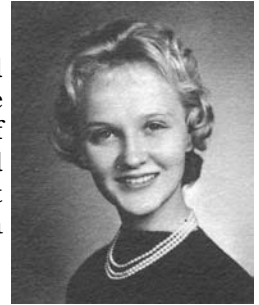

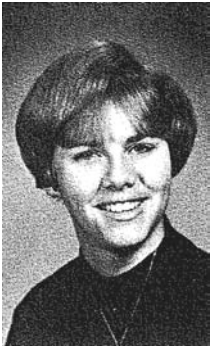

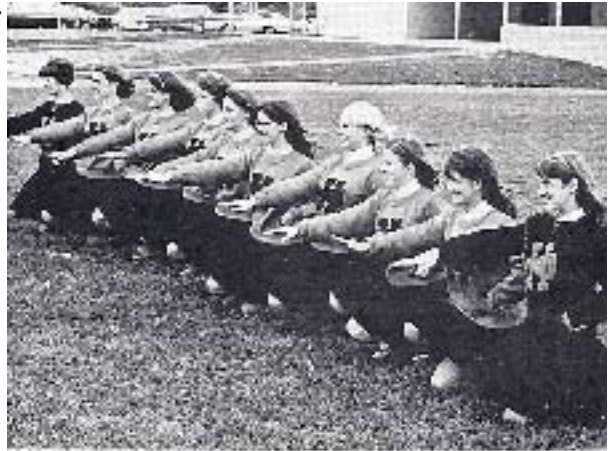
