




I don't miss high school it was NOT "the best time of my life." (as everyone kept telling me back

Keith Hayes, 52, of Long Valley, NJ passed away on April 20, 2011 at Morristown Memorial Hospital.

Ask Keith if he had traveled the world and he would say yes. Ask him what his favorite place was and he would say, home or "up at camp".

A strong and positive person, who was often described as a gentle, artistic, focused and talented, He knew and loved everything about plants, had a wicked sense of humor, and perfect hair. His idea of relaxation would be pruning his fruit trees or building car stopping snow sculptures or cutting trails at Mill Pond Park. Whether it was his job, his volunteer work or one of his many projects, he did it with only perfection as a goal.

Keith was born on February 21, 1959 in Hicksville, NY to the late William and Jean Hayes. His bond and love for his family was strong and he will be sorely missed by his brothers Bill and Glenn Hayes; his sister Lisa Hayes; his sister-in-law Sharon Hayes; his Aunt Kathleen and "Aunt" Elsie, both of whom held a special place in his heart, as well as his cousins, nieces and nephews.

After graduating from SUNY- Cobleskill and then the Rhode Island School of Design, he moved to Cedar Lake in Denville, NJ, with his partner. When they left, what became life long friends, and moved to Long Valley, he quickly became an involved member of the Long Valley community. Serving as President of the Washington Township Land Trust, he was committed and successful, with others just as dedicated, in preserving open space and the ongoing restoration of the Obadiah LaTourette Grist Mill. Keith placed a high value on preserving the history and architectural integrity of the community and served as a member of the Washington Township Historical Commission.

Prior to his career as an Office Manager for Trius Pest Management, where he knew every client off the top of his head and will be missed on a daily basis, Keith was a woven stylist in the home furnishing industry. It became very commonplace to hear him say "Oh, that's my fabric". One of his first jobs after graduating was with Elizabeth Eakins in New York City. His weaving skills executed her rug design that was installed in Gracie Mansion's Dinning room.

The outpouring of support and caring over the past few months has been overwhelming and gratefully appreciated. He will be missed by many but most of all by his loving partner of 28 years, Jim Fitterer and his dog, Tillie.

There will be a celebration of Keith held on Saturday, May 21, 2011 at the Mill Pond Park in Long Valley. Additional information will be posted on their website, www.wtlt.org







Honoring those who gave the ultimate sacrifice

Sobering to say the least! Memorial Day & Our Viet Nam casualties. Some thoughts to consider while reflecting on Memorial Day.

There are 58,267 names now listed on that polished black wall in Washington, D.C., including those added in 2010. The names are arranged in the order in which they were taken from us by date and within each date the names are alphabetized. It is hard to believe it is 36 years since the last casualties.

Beginning at the apex on panel 1E and going out to the end of the East wall, appearing to recede into the earth (numbered 70E - May 25, 1968), then resuming at the end of the West wall, as the wall emerges from the earth (numbered 70W - continuing May 25, 1968) and ending with a date in 1975. Thus the war's beginning and end meet. The war is complete, coming full circle, yet broken by the earth that bounds the angle's open side and contained within the earth itself.

The first known casualty was Richard B. Fitzgibbon, of North Weymouth, Mass. listed by the U.S. Department of Defense as having been killed on June 8, 1956. His name is listed on the Wall with that of his son, Marine Corps Lance Cpl. Richard B. Fitzgibbon III, who was killed on Sept. 7, 1965.

There are three sets of fathers and sons on the Wall.

12 soldiers on the Wall were 17 years old...Five soldiers on the Wall were 16 years old.

One soldier, PFC Dan Bullock was 15 years old.

997 soldiers were killed on their first day in Vietnam.

1,448 soldiers were killed on their last day in Vietnam.

31 sets of brothers are on the Wall.

The most casualty deaths for a single day was on January 31, 1968 - 245 deaths.

The most casualty deaths for a single month was May 1968 - 2,415 casualties were incurred. That's 2,415 dead in a single month!

Thirty one sets of parents lost two of their sons.

54 soldiers on the Wall attended Thomas Edison High School in Philadelphia.

Eight women are on the Wall. Nursing the wounded.

244 soldiers were awarded the Medal of Honor during the Vietnam War; 153 of them are on the Wall.

Beallsville, Ohio with a population of 475 lost six of her sons.

West Virginia had the highest casualty rate per capita in the nation. There are 711 West Virginians on the Wall.

The Marines of Morenci - They led some of the scrappiest high school football and basketball teams that the little Arizona copper town of Morenci (pop. 5,058) had ever known and cheered. They enjoyed roaring beer busts. In quieter moments, they rode horses along the Coronado Trail, stalked deer in the Apache National Forest. And in the patriotic camaraderie typical of Morenci's mining families, the nine graduates of Morenci.

High enlisted as a group in the Marine Corps. Their service began on Independence Day, 1966. Only three returned home.

The Buddies of Midvale - LeRoy Tafoya, Jimmy Martinez, Tom Gonzales were all boyhood friends and lived on three consecutive streets in Midvale, Utah on Fifth, Sixth and Seventh avenues. They lived only a few yards apart. They played ball at the adjacent sandlot ball field. And they all went to Vietnam. In a span of 16 dark days in late 1967, all three would be killed. LeRoy was killed on Wednesday, Nov. 22, the fourth anniversary of John F. Kennedy's assassination. Jimmy died less than 24 hours later on Thanksgiving Day. Tom was shot dead assaulting the enemy on Dec. 7, Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.
