


Directions:

Bob had been to school and got a degree in computer science and subsequently was responsible for the newsletter expanding to a website. Readership was growing and we were still in the dark ages in 2005. I think it was January when he asked to help with the newsletter.

He got in touch with me and I said it would be great to have help. We just had one of the original editors Pat Koziuk Driscoll from the class of 1956 resigned for health reasons. Without going into extreme detail, he put together a format for the newsletter and we went live I think in May of 2005. There was a gal from the class of 1960, Linda Piccerelli, who was another editor and me, we had separate jobs. She took care of a birthday and anniversary list and the master mailing list. I took all the emails and put it into a Word Perfect format and then sent it off to Bob who transferred the information to a PDF format and he would send it to the web master who threw it onto the Internet.

Bob and I talked every week and he decided to make a trip from Dannemora to Hicksville for a visit. He came for a weekend I think in 2008. We had a nice visit and even went to New Jersey to visit with Linda.

He was very busy doing his radio show and going to old folks homes and putting on a show. His main source of income was computer repair. He had a little shop where he did repair on portable stuff and actually had some corporations as clients and was on retainer.






Had no idea you were having a reunion. No one advised the newsletter about the get together. I will get the photos into the October issue. Can you provide some names??? Thanks bob


